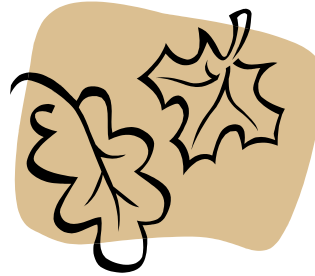

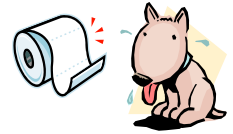
Daylight Saving Time ends November 4th, turn your clocks back one hour.
